This means that the children suffered the consequences of their parents' mistakes and sins. To show you understand this ancient proverb, complete these "modern" proverbs with a similar message.






The prophet Ezekiel used pictures to teach lessons to the people. Match the pictures below with Ezekiel's lessons.
