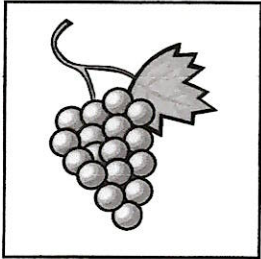

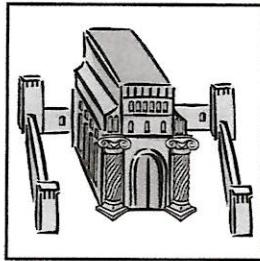
# Messages In Pictures

The prophet Ezekiel used pictures to teach lessons to the people. Match the pictures below with Ezekiel's lessons.



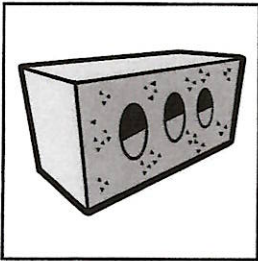
God will allow Babylon

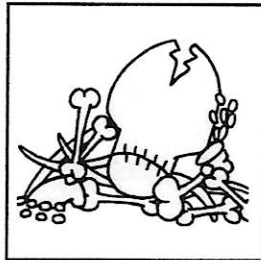
Captivity is like death, but God
