Lesson 5

Ezekiel Warns the People

Ezekiel was one of God's prophets—he spoke to the people for God. But he did more than just talk to the people—he *showed* the people what God wanted them to know, *by acting it out*.

One thing God wanted the people to know was that there would

be an attack on Jerusalem. Ezekiel acted out for the people how the attack would happen. He used a picture of Jerusalem and little army models. And, sure enough, the attack did happen just that way.

Do you remember that God's presence was in the temple where His people worshiped in Jerusalem? Ezekiel had a

vision from God to show Ezekiel that God was going to take Himself out of the temple. God was going to do this because His people just kept sinning and sinning.

hitting people


using pictures and models

God told Ezekiel to tell the people He was going to punish them because of their sin. So Ezekiel showed them. He also told the people and showed them that God would save them. Ezekiel

told them about God's temple. He drew the way God wanted the temple to look. He wrote down all of God's rules and laws so the people could obey God. Ezekiel was a good prophet for God.

God loves us so much. He expects us to love Him back and obey Him. When we keep disobeying Him, we will be punished. God always punishes each person for his own sin. Each person is responsible for his own sin— no one else will be punished for it.

What a great and good God we have! He always knows what is best for *each one* of us.
