

Jesus Is Betrayed

Jesus was teaching His followers about God and His kingdom. But some of the Jews were planning to kill Jesus! 

The time came for the Feast of the Passover, to celebrate the time when God led His people, the Jews, out of Egypt. All of the apostles ate the feast with Jesus in Jerusalem. While they were all eating, Jesus told them that one of them was going to betray Him. Jesus knew that it was Judas.



The Bible tells us something else very important about this feast Jesus had with His disciples: “...Jesus took bread. He gave thanks and broke it. He handed it to His disciples and said, ‘Take it. This is My body.’ Then He took the cup. He gave thanks and handed it to them....‘This is My blood....It is poured out for many.’”

This was a special feast, and we celebrate it every Sunday, our first day of the week. It is called the Lord's Supper. When we eat it, the bread reminds us of Jesus' body; and the grape juice reminds us of Jesus' blood that He gave for us when He died on the cross.

All of the apostles told Jesus that they would never leave Him because they loved Him so much. But Jesus told Peter that three times before the rooster crowed in the morning, Peter would deny that he even knew Jesus. Peter just couldn't believe it! He loved Jesus.
