Satan Tries Hurting Believers

Satan first tried to stop the spread of the gospel through persecution. This

The leaders put Peter and John in jail overnight and brought them before the Jewish court the next day. They asked

Acts 4:23-37

Believers met the physical needs of one another by:

- getting money from the government
- begging on the streets
- sharing

Peter and John how they healed the man who had never walked. Peter used this opportunity to tell more people about Jesus!

The Jewish leaders told Peter and John not to preach about Jesus any more, but they kept right on preaching. This made the Jewish leaders angry, and they put all the apostles in jail. During the night, an angel released the men from jail and told them to keep preaching. The next morning, the apostles went to the temple to preach about Jesus one more time.

When morning came, the Jews discovered the apostles missing from jail and found them preaching in the temple. The leaders brought the apostles into court and wanted to know why they did not follow their orders not to preach. Peter said, "We must obey God rather then men" (Acts 5:29).

The leaders wanted to kill the apostles right then and there. But a wise teacher named Gamaliel told them that if the apostles were doing God's work, they

could not stop them even if they wanted to. The Jews didn't like it, but they knew Gamaliel was right. They beat the apostles and told them

not to preach about Jesus anymore.

Satan Tries Tempting Believers

The first Christians pulled together and helped one another.
They studied God's Word together and shared with each other.

Those who had land and other items shared with those who didn't have enough. In some cases, believers sold their land or houses and gave money to the apostles to share with believers in need.

A husband and wife named Ananias and Sapphira sold some of their property. The money they received for the property was theirs, and they could do whatever they wanted to with it. Since they were believers, Ananias and Sapphira decided to give the money to help other believers. They brought part of the money to the apostles and made everyone think they

gave it all. Secretly, they kept back some of it for themselves.

When Ananias and Sapphira lied about the money, God struck them dead. God was making it clear that following Satan was dangerous

and wrong.

Acts 5:33-39

Gamaliel's advice about the apostles was to:


