Jesus Chose the Twelve

Many people followed Jesus. They heard Him teach and saw Him work miracles. For different reasons, some who once followed chose to return to their homes. But some stayed with Jesus. Peter, Andrew, James, and John, for example, left their fishing boats and everything else and followed Jesus. The time came when Jesus chose some of His followers to be special followers.

The night before He chose His twelve special followers, Jesus went to a mountain and spent the whole night praying. When the day dawned, Jesus called His followers and selected twelve of them as apostles — His special messengers. Their names

were Simon Peter, Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, another James, Simon the Zealot, Thaddaeus, and Judas Iscariot. From what we know about these men, they were regular men. They were not rich or famous. Four were fishermen. One was a tax-collector. They must

have been men of faith and character who could do the work to which Jesus called them. The Twelve had special and important work to do for Jesus!

The Apostles' Work

At first, Jesus sent the apostles only to the people of Israel, God's Old Testament people — the family of Abraham. God had prepared Israel for the Coming One, so His message was taken to them first. Jesus gave His closest followers power to cast out evil spirits and heal people of sicknesses and diseases. With these special powers, the apostles could help people and point them to Jesus as the Savior.

The apostles' work would not be easy. Jesus described it as sending out sheep in the middle of wolves. Many people in the world did not know God and did not want to know Him. They would not help the apostles, and some would try to get them to stop preaching. Jesus told them to do their work bravely and promised that the Spirit of God would be

with them.

Jesus gave the apostles authority to speak and write His Word. We have this Word today in the New Luke 7:18-23, 28-30

Come to Jesus

Herod had put John the Baptist in prison because he didn't like his preaching. While in prison, John began wondering if Jesus really was the Coming One. When men came to Jesus with John's question, Jesus instructed them to go back to John and tell him about seeing Jesus' mighty works.

These works show He was the Coming

One — the One sent by God to save the world from sin. Jesus explained that people have to be humble to follow Him. Many people think they

don't need a Savior; they think they can take care of everything by themselves.


