God Passes Over the Land

The *tenth plague* was that *the firstborn male child in each house would die*. Before God sent this plague, He told Moses and Aaron some very important things for the Israelites to do. God wanted each family to kill a perfect lamb or goat. Then they were to dip branches into the animals' blood and put the blood on the doorposts of their houses. This would save the firstborn male child in each family.

No one was to go outside that night. They were to cook and eat *all* of the lamb or goat that night. If any meat was left, God said not to eat it, but to burn the leftovers. The Israelites were told to eat quickly and go to bed with their clothes and sandals on!

That night, God went all over the land of Egypt. He made all of the firstborn male children and animals of the Egyptians die. But God *passed over* the houses with blood on the doorposts!




The firstborn male children in those houses were saved.

Who was killed in the last plague?

Who was saved?

Even *Pharaoh's* firstborn male child died because Pharaoh didn't obey God! That night Pharaoh told Moses and Aaron to take the Israelites and their things and get out of Egypt. That night, Pharaoh didn't say, "No!" He said, "Go!"



What plague did God send that *finally* made Pharaoh let God's people go?

From then on, the Israelites had a great feast to celebrate the night their houses were "*passed over.*" They called it the Feast of the Passover.

The people celebrated a feast each year to remember the night they left Egypt. It is called the Feast of the
