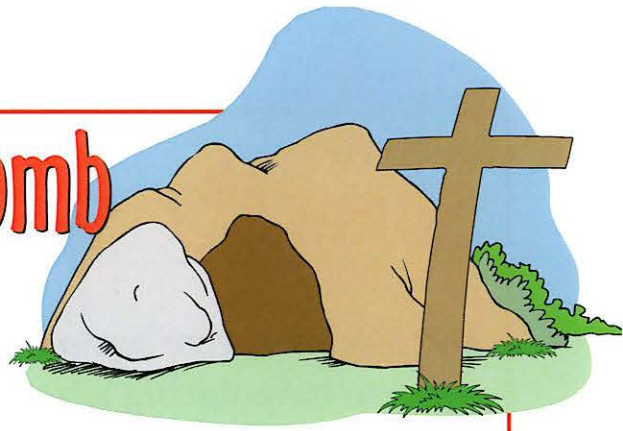

## Lesson 6

### Jesus Prays

The disciples were beginning to see that for the rest of their lives they were going to have the big job of telling others about Jesus. So Jesus helped them get ready to do that work by telling them about a vine. Jesus said that He was the main vine and they were all branches growing off of that vine. A branch without a vine isn't any good, so they needed to always believe and follow Jesus, the vine. The branches of a vine are the parts that have fruit on them. But a branch isn't good for anything if it doesn't have fruit. So, Jesus told the disciples they needed to have "fruit" on them. Each one of us needs to be a branch joined to Jesus, too. He is our vine. And each one of us needs to have fruit on our branch. Here is what Jesus meant:

The fruit God wants us to have is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. This means we will love people, be kind to them, and get along with others. It also means we will obey God and tell others about Jesus. If we do all of those things and keep loving Jesus in our hearts, we will stay joined to our vine Jesus and have fruit on our branch.

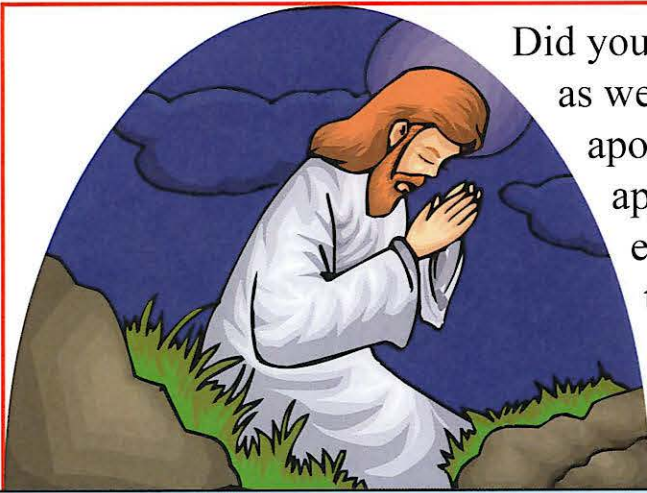

Did you know that Jesus prayed to God just as we do? After He finished talking to His apostles, Jesus prayed. He prayed for the apostles—that God would help them and encourage them when people were mean to them and tried to kill them. He asked God to protect them. Jesus knew that God would answer His prayer.
