

Psalms About Jesus

Sometimes David wrote Psalms about Jesus. But wait! David lived and died hundreds of years before Jesus was born. So how could David write about Jesus?

Remember, God told the men who wrote the Bible to write His words. God wanted the people



in David's time to know that some day He would send His Son Jesus to save all of the people from their sins. Sending Jesus was the greatest thing that God ever did for His people. So David wrote about Jesus because God told him what to write.

Who told David what to write? _____

In the Psalms, David told many things about Jesus. He even told us where Jesus is now! Jesus is in heaven sitting down at God's right hand. When a king asked someone to sit down at his right hand, it was an important place. It meant that person had as much power as the king had. So David said in his Psalms that Jesus would some day sit in a special place at God's right hand and have God's power. And that is where Jesus is right now—in heaven with God!

What does it mean to “sit at God’s right hand?”

It is wonderful to know that God sent His Son Jesus to die so that we can be forgiven for our sins. It is wonderful to know that Jesus will come again to take us to live with Him forever. I'm so glad, aren't you?
