

## Lesson #13 – Review

Today we are going to review our lessons for this quarter's study. As we study the Old Testament, we see that God is Holy. We are to be holy also. This means we are to be set apart or different from the world. We are to try not to sin. We should try to be our best for God.

You remember that God gave Moses the 10 Commandments to follow. There were also 600 + other laws they were to follow. God also gave Moses instructions for building a tabernacle so they would have a place to worship God. God expected His people to worship Him regularly. They were to make sacrifices of animals on the altar to atone for their sins.

Aaron was selected to be the High Priest who was to work in the tabernacle. His sons were priests who made the sacrifices daily and kept the tabernacle working well. His sons Nadab and Abihu offered strange fire upon the altar of incense, and the fire came out and consumed them. We should learn that God expects complete obedience to His instructions.

God had selected the seventh day, the Sabbath, to be their day of worship. Christians today are to worship each first day of the week, Sunday. We are to remember the sacrifice of Jesus and to sing praises to God on this day.

Finally, God's people were told to move on toward the Promised Land. Moses sent 12 spies into the land to check it out. When they returned, only 2 spies, Joshua and Caleb, thought they could go in and take the land. The others had no faith in God. They frightened the whole camp so that they would not go in. God was angry and caused the people to wander in the wilderness for 40 years.

The Israelite people complained a lot. They were seldom satisfied with things. Many people wanted to be the leader instead of Moses. Korah, Dathan, and Abiram wanted to throw Moses out and be the leaders. God did not allow this and had the earth swallow them.

One time God sent snakes into the camp because the people complained so much. Many died and God told Moses to put a bronze snake on a pole for the people to look upon. If they came to look at the snake, they would be healed. We must look to Jesus to be saved.

Moses got out of patience with so much complaining. Once when they needed water, God told Moses to SPEAK to a rock. Instead, Moses struck the rock. God expects complete obedience and God told Moses he would not enter the land because he did not obey exactly. How sad!

Just before the wandering was over, Balak, king of Moab, knew the Israelites were coming through his country. He sent for Balaam to curse them. Balaam, however, could only say what God told him to say so he blessed the people. You will remember that in this lesson we studied about Balaam's donkey that actually talked!

Finally, the Israelites were at the Jordan River. They were almost there! God selected Joshua to be the new leader. Moses went up to Mt. Nebo to see the new land, but he died there. Moses had done a very good job in leading the people to the Promised Land. He spoke to them just before going upon Mount Nebo and encouraged them to stay faithful to God.
