Grasping the Opportunity: Expect the Unexpected

Acts 9:15-16

Introduction:

1. The Lord speaking to Ananias about Saul: "Go, for he is a chosen vessel of Mine to bear My name before Gentiles, kings, and the children of Israel. [16] For I will show him how many things he must suffer for My name's sake."
2. To bear Christ's name to anyone, we must first begin, and then make a commitment to succeed—no matter how many things we must suffer for His name's sake.
3. There is built-in success for the conscientious worker who knows that he must expect the unexpected. Are you ready to grasp the opportunity?

II. Continue the Work, but Expect the Unexpected.

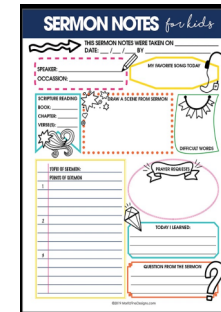
III. Complete the Work, but Expect the Unexpected.
